New Products

New RCM Coils

ESP has been developing design changes to our refrigerant cooling Coils since 2000. We are finally in the production stage of design and wish to promote the advances of the RCM coils over the old RM coils. The first advantage of the new RCM coil is the re-circuiting of the coil passes. The RCM coil has Top to bottom distribution of refrigerant Resulting in a more even heat transfer throughout the coil, leading to higher efficiency cooling.



The RCM coils employ rifled copper tubing as opposed to smooth. This results in turbulent flow of the refrigerant as opposed to laminar, and again higher efficiency cooling is achieved. We have also incorporated a PVC positive flow drain pan into the RCM coil casings. The drain pan is designed to drastically reduce the amount of standing water and thus eliminate concerns regarding Legionella and other possible bacteria growth. The drain pan is very user friendly with two 3/4" FIP PVC drain connections available (one acts as the primary connection and the other is a back up). The RCM coil comes supplied with a nylon mesh screen, which when installed prevents moisture carry-over from the coil to the motor and blower. Finally, an increased suction line temperature is produced which leads to steadier operation and better conditions to limit frost build up on the coil.

ESP began production of the RCM-50 coils in March 2003 and after months of rigorous testing, we will be releasing the new RCM-70 coils in July 2003. We are currently in the testing stages of the RCM-100, and hope to release them in September 2003. Please note that all old-style coils will be referred to as RM series and all new style coils will be RCM series.
